# 2022-2023 MTA SECONDARY INDIVIDUAL EVENTS QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

This is meant as a general information guide.

Acting Solo:	1	Two contrasting monologues are required.  Both monologues are performed by one actor portraying only one character in each of the monologues.	3 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>One chair may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Two contrasting monologues are required.</li> <li>Both monologues are performed by one actor portraying only one character in each of the monologues.</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, my name is John Smith from school 7, and I will be performing A Midsummer Night's Dream by William Shakespeare and Rabbit Hole by David Lindsay-Abaire."</li> </ul>
Acting Duet	2	<ul> <li>Performed by two actors, portraying two characters (one character each).</li> <li>Each participant must be actively involved in the scene.</li> </ul>	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>Two chairs may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Each performer portrays one character.</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, we are John Smith and Jane Jones from school 2 and we will be performing The Nerd by Larry Shue."</li> </ul>
Acting Group	3-10	Performance of a group scene     Each participant must be actively involved in the scene.	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>One chair per group member may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, we are John Smith, Jane Jones, and James Doe from school 10 and we will be performing Rehearsal for Murder by D.D. Brooke."</li> </ul>
Original Scene	2-5	The selection must be an original work and the writer must be involved with the development of the scene. Should be as equally balanced between the characters as possible.	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>One chair per group member may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Scenes may be serious or humorous in nature or may contain elements that are both comedic and dramatic.</li> <li>Slate must include the students' names, the students' roles in the development of the scene, the school code, and the selection title.</li> </ul>
Musical Solo	1	Performance of one song from a published musical, portraying one character	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>One chair may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Performers must use pre-recorded, non-vocal musical accompaniment.</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, name is Jane Jones from school 4 and I will be performing 'Children Will Listen' from Into the Woods."</li> </ul>
Musical Duet	2	<ul> <li>Musical selection performed by two actors, each actor portraying one character.</li> <li>Each participant must be actively involved in the scene.</li> </ul>	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>Two chairs may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Performers must use pre-recorded, non-vocal musical accompaniment.</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, we are John Smith and Jane Jones from school 6 and we will be performing 'Only Us' from Dear Evan Hansen."</li> </ul>
Musical Group	3-5	Musical selection performance of one group song from a musical     Each participant must be actively involved in the scene.	5 minutes	<ul> <li>Virtual Preliminaries</li> <li>One chair per group member may be used; no props or set pieces</li> <li>Slate example: "Hello, we are John Smith, Jane Jones, and James Doe from school 10 and we will be performing 'Money, Money, Money' from Mama Mia."</li> </ul>
Costume Design, Makeup Design, Publicity Design, Scenic Design	1	Create and present a design from your chosen category for a theoretical or fully-realized play or musical.		<ul> <li>In-person at MTA</li> <li>The design submitted by the student should be wholly the creative product of the student and original in nature.</li> </ul>

## **Event Requirements:**

- Students may participate in no more than five (5) individual events.
- Students may not enter the same event twice.
- All performance selections must be memorized.
- Duet and group selections should be as equally balanced among all characters as possible.
- Performers must slate before beginning their performance and end their performance with "thank you."

#### **Musical Events:**

- Performers must use pre-recorded, non-vocal musical accompaniment.
  - a. No live accompaniment will be allowed.
  - b. For in-person rounds, all music must be downloaded onto the entrant's device.
  - c. See "Equipment" under General Information for full guidelines.

## **Material Selections:**

- Material must be drawn from published plays.
  - a. Works from other literary forms such as poetry, fiction, stand up/sketch comedy, or song lyrics are not permitted.
  - b. Original works are prohibited except in the Original Scene category.
  - c. Musical Theatre material must be from published musicals. Popular music will not be permitted unless it is included in the score of a published musical.
  - d. Entrants will be required to identify the company that holds the rights to the play or musical from which their material is selected.
- Selections should be appropriate to the performers and should provide interest, intelligibility, and literary value.
- Performers should demonstrate evidence of understanding in regards to the selection's context and intent.

#### Attire:

- No costumes or theatrical makeup is allowed.
- Participants are encouraged to dress as they would for a general audition or job interview.
- All black attire is welcome, but not required.

## Language & Content:

Directors and students should use discretion in regards to language and subject matter

#### Teachers:

- Teachers may register up to ten (10) entries per category.
- ALL participants (performance & technical) must be registered by the November 15<sup>th</sup> deadline.
- School codes will be sent with students' FlipGrid names and passwords after registration closes.

#### Timeline:

- November 15: Registration for Schools participating in 2IEs
- November 15 December 15: Virtual Preliminary Performance Submissions Window
- January 1: Preliminary Judging Complete
- January 6: Finalists Announced
- January 14: Secondary IEs Final Round; Presentation and Judging of Technical Events
- Following MTA: Teachers Receive Respondent Feedback (via email for prelims; in-person at the awards ceremony for finalists)
